

Year 11 Parent Information Evening Q&A

Q1 Are Year 11 doing revision in Science lessons currently?

A1 Students shouldn't rely on special revision lessons in class for the February and March PPEs, they need to do this themselves. Materials and advice are provided and there are revision questions at the start of every lesson (known as revise in 5) but this is not intended to be the bulk of revision, which students are responsible for themselves. Similarly, as Science courses finish over the next month or two staff will of course revise in the remaining lessons but again students should not rely on this as their sole or main source of Science revision. Students should begin their Science revision as soon as possible if they have not done so already, this way they can do frequent manageable amounts, say 20 minutes before changing activity, using methods which they know work for them. (The slides at the ends of the Science section provide ideas for this). There is strong evidence from brain research that the more nights' sleep you have between starting revision and taking the test, the better.

Q2 Will students need to memorise the SUVAT equations for Separate Science Physics?

A2 Equations do not need to be memorised by the current Year 11 as all equations will be provided. That said, students need to be familiar with choosing, using and rearranging all equations and so will probably memorise a number of them in the process.

Q3 What formula do students get for Maths?
